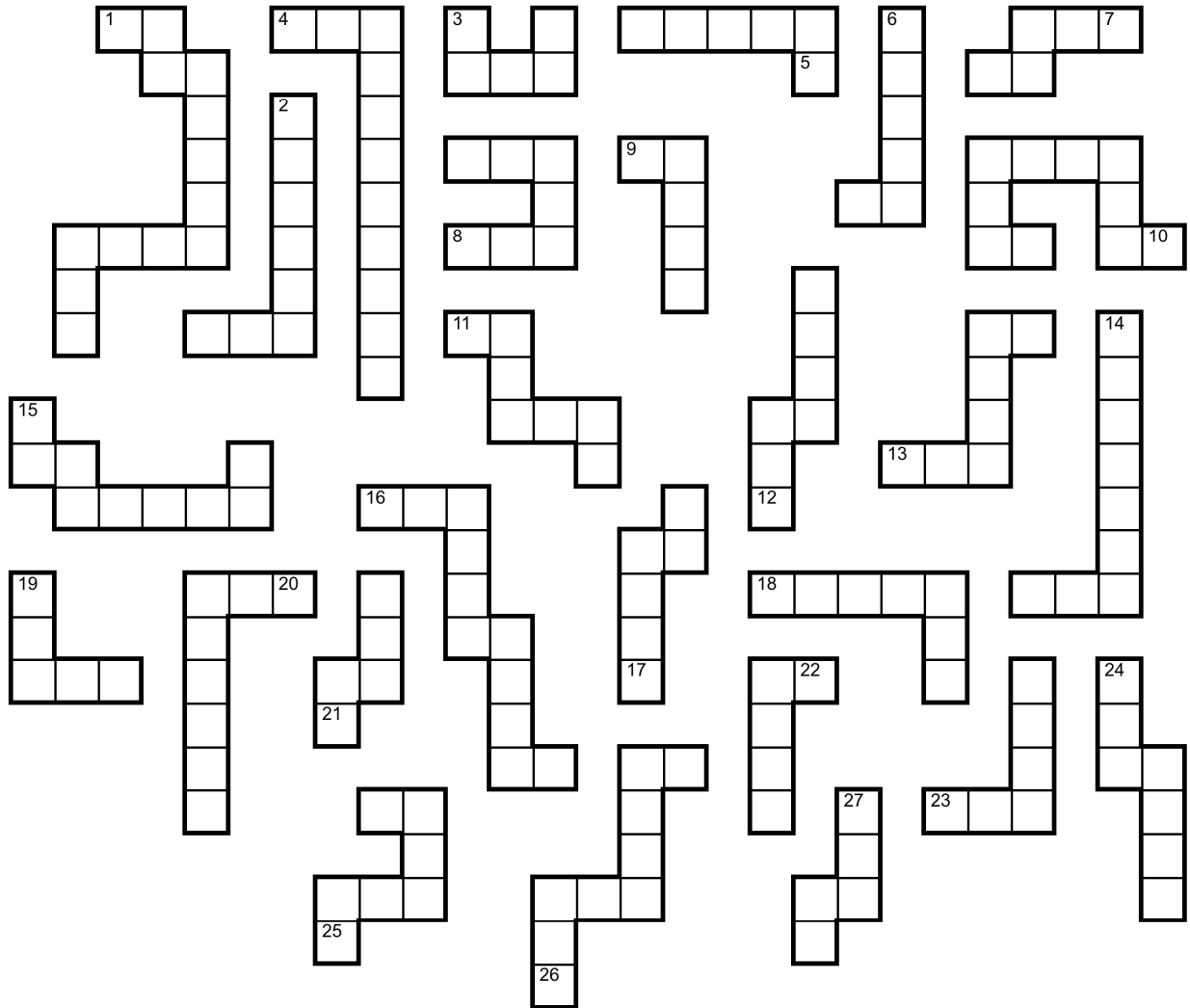


Some Assembly Required #1
